Grace and peace from our Savior Jesus Christ. We celebrated the Epiphany during January as a remembrance when Jesus was revealed to the world as God incarnate, the King of all kings for Jews and Gentiles. We sang praises to our God because joy, light, and salvation have come to the world!

Through the hardships of 2020 and the volatile start to 2021, God remains faithful. I believe that God calls for us every second of every hour. I believe that God's love for us is greater than we can comprehend. God loves us so much that He sacrificed Himself on the cross that we would be welcomed and reconciled to God by accepting Jesus as our Savior and allowing Christ to reign in our hearts. The crucifixion of Jesus on the cross was the final sacrifice of our sin debt being forgiven.

February marks the beginning of the Lenten season. Lent is the 40 days from Ash Wednesday to Easter/Resurrection Sunday. It has evolved into a period during which participants reflect on the work and life of Jesus, His suffering and death on our behalf, and the significance of His burial and resurrection from death. Our redemption through Christ Jesus is a wonderful reason to rejoice and reflect on our relationship with God, especially during these trying times.

As we enter this Lenten season, let us remember the self-examination, repentance,

preparation, and the hope this time represents. Keep looking for strength through Christ to persevere the difficult road ahead. Tremendous patience will be needed to allow enough time for vaccinations to reach a critical number and for us to gain a better understanding of the life cycle of COVID-19, the way it may impact people differently, and the severity of any additional strains.

I found the words of the American poet,
Amanda Gorman, named National Youth Poet
Laureate, quite assuring. In her published
poem, The Hill We Climb, she asserts that we
are not a nation that is broken, but a simply
unfinished nation. We lift our eyes, "not to see
what stands between us, but what stands
before us. We close the divide because we
know, to put our future first, we must first put
our differences aside We lay down our arms
so we can reach out our arms to one another."
She concludes with, "The new dawn blooms
as we free it for there is always light; if only
we're brave enough to see it; If only we're
brave enough to be it."

This echoes the spirit of love to which Jesus beckons us to take heart and fear not. He teaches that we are to love God and to love our neighbors as ourselves. Jesus says there are no greater commandments than these. Beloved of God, this world needs the light of God's Love. Be encouraged, believe in God's promises, and be the hope and compassion needed to repair this world. Let the light of God's love shine through your thoughts, words, and actions.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The cash receipt and expenditure activity for the period December 1 thru December 31, 2020. The category Current-Mission-Property encompasses the options on the weekly giving envelop. These costs cover the basic needs to keep your church operational (i.e salaries, utililities, insurance,

property maintenance). The Capital category is refering to the capital section of the giving envelope. The monies here are applied to the loan obtained for the santuary renovation in 2009. Giant Card program is another way to support the church through Giant Markets giving back 5% of the total sales made by obtaing a Giant Gift Card.

This is the final monthly report for 2020. Keep your eyes open for additional correspondence in the next several weeks regarding the 2020 Financial Statement. We realize this type of information maybe overbearing at times. It is not our purpose to create the mindset that all *they* want is money. Our goal is to keep you informed with the data we have to work with.

This is important to make the required decision with the resources that God has intrusted us with. In God we Trust and our HOPE is in him. Two ways as a family of God we work together to make smart decisions with our data.


