GIANT CARD PROGRAM ENHANCEMENT

Do you regularly do your grocery shopping at Giant Stores? We have an enhancement to assist in a convenient way to participate and at the same time provide a simple source of funds for the church.

You can now order Giant gift cards through our online giving program. The cards can be ordered in denominations of \$50, \$100, \$200 and \$300. log onto the church web site at Simply drylanducc.org and select the on-line giving button. Once you've logged on you can select "one time" or "recurring donations" and select the Giant Card Program fund. The funds will automatically be deducted from the account you have selected (checking, savings or credit card). If you choose to order on-line, please place your order by the 20th of the month. This assures proper credit and allows time for bank clearing. When the cards are received from Giant, you will be contacted to arrange for pickup.

We have had the Giant gift card program for several years and it is a simple way for the church to earn 5% of the total orders.

ON-LINE GIVING!!

Many of our members know that on-line giving has been offered for several years and has been a blessing to a number of our members. It offers an avenue to regularly give and not be concerned about writing checks or putting cash in the offering plate.

With on-line giving you select if you want to give on a recurring basis (i.e., weekly, bi-weekly or monthly), on a specific day of the week or a specific day of the month. You can also make a contribution as you find it convenient to you each month. Recently we have expanded the selection of funds that you can decide to contribute to from 5 to 11 funds. This allows for greater flexibility in your giving decision. On-line giving has proven to be of great benefit to the finance committee in providing regular and expected revenue in covering the regular monthly expenses of the church.

To sign up for on-line giving, simply go to the church web site at www.drylanducc.org and click on the give on-line button. The process is easy and quick to complete. An e-mail address is necessary to participate. If choosing a recurring gift option, you will be reminded each time the transaction will take place. You can use your bank account as a source of funding or your credit or debit card. If you need further information, contact the church office at 610-759-4444.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

Dryland UCC Welcomes Meals on Wheels of the Greater Lehigh Valley

Meals on Wheels (MOW) provides a meal delivery service primarily for seniors with disabilities. At present, meals are prepared at their Bethlehem facility on Fritch Dr. These meals are then delivered by volunteers to clients in Nazareth and other neighboring towns. MOW however is closing the Fritch Dr. facility and moving it to Allentown in September 2021 and needs a new distribution site for their Nazareth routes.

Dryland consistory has approved a plan that allows Dryland to serve as the new distribution site for MOW's Nazareth routes. This agreement allows a MOW vehicle and volunteers to access our packing lot for the purpose of dropping off meal containers and allow volunteers to pick them up for delivery to clients. Volunteers would return empty containers for overnight storage in an outside shed that will be located along the rear edge of the parking lot. Empty containers would be picked up the next morning when full containers are again delivered to Dryland. Drop-off and pick-up would occur between 10:00 am and 12:00 pm, Monday thru Friday. The tentative date to start using Dryland is September 1, 2021.

No access to the church building or use of Dryland staff is needed. We are simply sharing our parking lot and agree to locate a shed on our property to facilitate the dropping off & picking up of meal containers.

INSIDE PROPERTY REPORT

Continue in the process of cleaning up the key list and having keys returned to the church for reuse.

The facility and Sanctuary, continues to be cleaned and areas wiped down. Continue to sanitize. after dinner takeout events.

Fogel's completed the preventative maintenance on all A/C and heat pump systems.

Received estimate and quote from Fogel's on A/C units for CEC/ Kitchen and Office. Instructed Fogel's to order and schedule the unit replacement for the office and install the split system in the kitchen.

Estimate was turned over to Finance committee. Dewayne will present it to consistory at Thursday. meeting.

Started to reschedule the outside organization's... presently the Quilters, Naz Garden club, BS #76 Troop and GS # 8587 is on the schedule. Waiting for word on other GS troops and BS troops and will be contacting the other few groups for their schedules.

New Air conditioning System

A new 2 1/2-ton Air Conditioning system (Compressor and Air Handler) was installed for the church office, pastor's study and choir room area on June 25, 2021. This falls in line with our original AC Project projections from 2018.

Also on order is a split AC unit for the Kitchen. We must keep our Kitchen volunteers cool as they make the drive-up dinners.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The cash receipt and expenditures activity for the period May 1 thru May 31, 2021. The category Current-Mission-Property encompasses the options on the weekly giving envelop. These costs cover the basic needs to keep your church operational (i.e., salaries, utilities, insurance, property maintenance). The Capital category is referring to the capital section of the giving envelope. The monies here are applied to the loan obtained for the sanctuary renovation in 2009. Giant Card Program is another way to support the church through Giant Markets giving back 5% of the total sales made by obtaining a Giant Gift Card. The Note area is a guide to keep us on target for meeting our financial commitments.

For your information and support --- The Finance Committee presented the following proposal at the June Consistory Meeting for their approval. The Consistory approved the proposal. This is a joint effort working with the Inside Property and Outside Property Committees. Proposal:

- 1. (Outside Property) Proceed with replacing damaged Slate on the sanctuary roof.
- 2. (Inside Property) Proceed to replace Air Conditioning unit for the offices area and install a new unit for the kitchen area.

As of drafting this article, the Kitchen Crew has donated a total of \$9,830 toward these projects. Total bid costs for these projects are \$12,610. So far that the congregation has contributed \$200.00 toward 'Buy A Slate' for the slate roof repair.

3. The air conditioner on the west side of the CEC is not in service. Bid cost to remedy that problem is \$11,760. We will not proceed with that work until additional funds are acquired.

Again, this is just a summary of the required work that needs to be done to keep our facility safe and comfortable. We are open to any questions or

concerns. We encourage your feedback so together we can maintain open and vibrate communications.

We Appreciate and Thank each of you for your generosity no matter the size to assure the church remains part of the community and part of your life. There is plenty of work to accomplish, so don't feel bashful to pitch in.
