Do you regularly shop at Giant Food Stores for your essential food and other items? If you do, we would like to ask you to consider a program that will financially benefit Dryland U.C.C.

If you shop at Giant and pay for your items by check or by cash, please consider participating in the Giant Gift Card program offered by Dryland. Here is how the program works. You designate the amount of gift card you wish to purchase (i.e. \$50.00, \$100.00, \$200.00, etc.) and pay the church via check or cash for that amount. We will order a

gift card for you in that amount and you are able to use it at any Giant Food Store for the face amount until the balance is used up (no deductions or restrictions). You get full value.

Dryland U.C.C. is given credit of 5% of the amount you order. So, for each \$1,000.00 in cards ordered, the church benefits in the amount of \$50.00.

We have been participating in this program with Giant Stores for several years and the benefit has been about \$1,200.00 annually toward meeting our annual budget. There has been a core group of about 10 members who take advantage of this program. We would like to double or triple this figure to help offset the expenses of the church.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The cash receipt and expenditure activity for the period September 1 thru September 30, 2019 is attached. The category Current-Mission-Property encompasses the options on the weekly giving envelope. These costs cover the basic needs to keep your church operational (i.e salaries, utililties, insurance, property maintenance). The Capital category is refering to the capital section of the giving envelope. The monies here are applied to the loan obtained for the santuary renovation in 2009. Giant Card program is another way to support the church through Giant Markets giving back 5% of total sales made by obtaing a Giant Gift Card.

The Note area is a guide to keep us on target for meeting our commitments.

Keeping you informed – At the annual congregational meeting held in January, we stated that we have begun replacing the air conditioning units throughout the building. We have a total of 7 units, all having been installed 25+ years ago. Maintenance issues and operating efficiences have driven us to undertake this task. Approximate cost to replace each unit is \$7,500.00. We replaced one in the Christian Education Center in 2018 and by the end of 2019 we will replace one in the sanctuary. We will have another 5 years to complete the remaining units. The replacement cost is an annual budget item approved at the annual congregational meeting.

Also, we have created a short range and long range project list. An immediate short range goal to be completed in the Spring is repair the stucco in front of the church. We have begun allocating funds toward this project. At this time, the projects on this list are marked as funds must be obtained first before the project is started and completed.
